#### **Accelerated Reading**

A massive well-done to students in Years 7 and 8 who have been busy reading and taking quizzes on their AR books. To date, they have read 28,085,221 words, passing quizzes on 1,140 books. Eight students have read over a million words each.

#### The Brilliant Book Award

This is an award run by the Education Library Service and sees young people across Nottinghamshire reading, discussing and voting for the best in new Young Adult fiction. This year more than 20 students from years 7, 8 and 9 have been participating. Our favourite book on the shortlist is *Jamie* by L.D. Lapinski.

#### **Author visits**

We have been pleased to welcome two authors to school this term. L.D. Lapinski and Sufiya Ahmed spoke about their books *Jamie* and *Rosie Raja: Churchill's Spy*, both of which are on this year's *Brilliant Book Award* shortlist as well as about some of the wider issues that concern them.

#### Take Over Arts Festival 2024

Takeover is a programme powered by the government's Volunteering Futures Fund, aimed at fostering the creative talents of young people in Mansfield and Ashfield aged 14-24yrs. On 9th March young people took over the old Debenhams site in The Four Seasons shopping Centre in Mansfield. All Year 10 Art students were involved in the creation of the artwork, with some photography students taking part on the day. OAKi's aim was to create puppets and the theme was bugs. Students created shadow puppets and a giant spider puppet over 5ft wide created from recycled materials including an umbrella, newspapers and plastic saved from landfill. The festival space was dressed with home made foliage and flowers as well as a bubble machine and a seated area. There were a host of activities on the day including circus skills, DJing ,printing, photography workshop, games, silent disco and various crafts.

It was a fantastic day for all who attended and nearly 2,000 came to see the talented young people including local press, Inspire, families, friends and the general public. To quote a primary aged youngster who attended, 'wow that spider's amazing. I want to go to Kirkby so I can make amazing art!'

The 'Being a Parent - Living with Teenagers' Course.

#### What is EPEC?

### Who is it suitable for?

Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities Being A Parent - living with Teenagers Course is a free, volunteer-led, evidence-based parenting programme



Each session is delivered by two Parent Group Leaders (PGLs) who have received 60+ hours training to deliver EPEC courses and have **lived experience** of parenting teenagers.

Our sessions empower parents to share experiences, learn new skills and practice these alongside other parents, who are facing similar circumstances. If you are a parent/carer with pre teen/s or a teenager/s and you are unsure about some of the behaviours presenting and feel that some support and guidance would be helpful. This course is for you.

Our course offers support to parents/carers, helping them to learn more about parenting a teenager. Along with helping parents/carers to manage emotion and behavioural difficulties that their young person may be experiencing.

The course gives lots of opportunity for discussion around shared experiences in an accepting and supportive environment.

### Course Content

Session 1 Key issues for teenagers and their parents - Setting goals. Looking after yourself as a parent. Session 2 Effective communication skills - Parenting Styles. Listening skills Session 3 Building your teenager's self-esteem - Needs behind behaviour. Feelings. Valuing your teenager and building

their self-esteem Session 4 Positive parenting strategies - Family meetings. Focused

activities.

Session 5 Managing conflict - Negotiation. Discipline. Session 6

Discipline strategies - Parenting strategy review Session 7

Protecting them from risk - What's normal? what's worrying? What makes a difference helping teenagers manage risk? Raising difficult issues. Supporting problem

Sophie competed in the Shot Put, 2 Lap Race & 4x 2 Lap Relay. Sophie won the UI3g Shot Put competition with a throw of 8.50m, so as well as being the Notts UI3g County Champion (outdoors), she is now also the East Midlands Sportshall regional champion at the Indoor Shot Put.

This was the last competition that Sophie could compete as an UI3. She now moves up to UI5.

- 4. Choose sign in with Google and then use their school account details
